
A Plethora of Resources

NEW UTICA LOCATION!

LCL recently purchased a building at 115 South Main Street in Utica, just south of its current location at 15 North Main Street. This interim space will provide an American with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant entrance and restrooms, and an expanded and a more convenient parking lot. The building also includes a common area for Library programming, individual use and small group meetings. A highlight of the building is a drive-up window, which will allow on-the-go customers to quickly pick up and drop off books from their vehicles.

Empowered Minds: Barn Quilt Trails in Ohio

MARCH 16 | 11AM - 12PM | DOWNTOWN NEWARK 

Filmmaker Julianne Donofrio discusses the very colorful history of barn quilts and Barn Quilt Trails across Ohio in her 2016 documentary "Pieced Together." A Barn Quilt Trail is a vivid collection of square wood panels, or "barn quilts," depicting vivid quilt patterns displayed on public and private buildings. Quilting devotees can follow the trail and experience the beauty of the quilting while exploring the surrounding countryside. Barn Quilt Trails celebrate the heritage of quilt making and honor the women who began the tradition. In 2001, Donna Sue Groves started the Barn Quilt Trail movement, to honor her mother, in Adams County, Ohio. There are now trails in 43 US states, as well as in Canada.

Local History Movie Night: *Our Town* - Newark

Deindustrialized Newark: A Presentation by OSU Honors Students on Newark's Past and Present

Searching for Mary: Murder, Memory and Making More of Local History

APRIL 23 | 1PM | DOWNTOWN NEWARK 

In late 1819, a group of Stockbridge Indians was viciously attacked as they traveled through central Ohio. A pregnant woman was killed, a Native infant was adopted by a local family, and a murderer was put on trial. Although a fragmentary account of the incident became part of the early lore of Knox and Licking counties, this event has never been examined closely nor placed into broader historical contexts.



In-Person Classes: Downtown Newark

● **B-24 Tail Gunner; My Dad in WWII • March 8 • 1 - 2pm**

At the age of 20, during 1944 and 1945, Mike Shurig's father laid his life on the line. He survived thirty combat missions in the Air War over Europe. Armed with twin 50-caliber machine guns in the tail turret of a B-24 Liberator heavy bomber, he faced German fighters and flak, watched his friends blown from the skies, bailed out at 10,000 feet, and crash-landed. During this course, students examine the combat attire worn by WWII bomber crews. Shurig also reads from his father's well written personal war stories that captured the feelings, emotions and essence that gripped him during those experiences.

● **Cutting the Cord 101 • March 9 • 3 - 4:30pm**

Using the internet to stream TV and movies has become very popular over the past several years. In this class, our Techsperts introduce the basics of streaming, what equipment is needed, what services are available, and how to get local channels.

● **The World's First Malaria Vaccine And The 40 Years It Took To Develop • March 10 • 4 - 5pm**

In this talk, Dr. Matt Rouhier, professor of Chemistry at Kenyon College, discusses mosquitoes, malaria and the struggles to develop the first WHO recommended malaria vaccine.

● **Plant This Not That • March 15 • 12:30 - 2:30pm**





Lisa Stein Haven, Professor of English at Ohio University Zanesville, re-introduces us to the Beat Generation artists, confined to Jack Kerouac, Allen Ginsberg and, one you might not have heard of, Bob Kaufman. Her presentation is prefaced by a discussion of the father of the movement, Lawrence Ferlinghetti, who recently passed at the age of 101 in February 2021.

● **Buckeye Book Club • March 29 • 12 - 1pm**

In partnership with the Ohioana Library, the Buckeye Book Club explores books by some of the best Ohio-based authors. Bring your lunch and enjoy a deep dive on our March 2022 title: *World of Wonders: In Praise of Fireflies, Whale Sharks, and Other Astonishments* by Aimee Nezhukumatathil.



● **A Holocaust Survivor's Journey through Life: Reflections of a Loving Son • March 30 • 11am - 12:30pm**

Larry Moses shares the story of his mother, a survivor of Auschwitz, before, during and then long after the war.

● **Rural Action in Appalachia • April 5 • 1 - 2pm**

Marissa Lautzenheiser presents a general introduction to Rural Action and the group's important mission. She takes attendees on a deeper dive into some of Rural Action's program areas, including sustainable forestry, sustainable agriculture, watersheds and environmental education. A hands-on element is included.



● **Protecting Your Bank Accounts • April 6 • 2 - 3pm**

Professional bankers explain how financial institutions protect your bank accounts and information from unauthorized use both online and offline. They show you how you can help protect your assets and information from being used without your permission, and what to do if that happens.

● **US Foreign Policy at Present: Will the Future at all Resemble the Past? • April 13 • 4 - 5pm**

The international threat landscape for the United States appears as uncertain and confounding as at any point since World War II. How might we best make sense of the paths available to policymakers to cope with emerging challenges across the globe? Analysts often look to the past when plotting a course for foreign policy going forward. Are any of the patterns of the past seventy-five years relevant for coping with the manifold potential threats the US faces? Is looking to the past even relevant when considering the mix of state-based and non-state threats confronting the security of the United States? Denison University Professor Andrew Z. Katz speaks on US Foreign Policy and helps attendees make sense of the near-term future of US foreign policy by asking whether the past provides any guidelines for the challenges that lie ahead.



● **The Story of the Harrison Farm • April 21 • 1 - 2pm**




